Methodology

Poll number: pr2019

Interview Dates: September 8-9, 2020

Sample Population: 1517 registered voters in the United States.

Sample Selection: Scientific online poll - stratified sample of panel respondents.

Weighting Parameters: The sample was weighted based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Voting and Registration Supplement to the Current Population Survey for registered voters in the United States based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, census region, and Hispanic ethnicity.

This topline provides weighted percentages, as well as the unweighted N-size for the total sample. Due to the effects of weighting and rounding, figures may or may not add up to 100%. The standard deviation of the weights was: 0.2248683. The maximum weight was: 2.3401524. The minimum weight was: 0.4112792. 95% of the weights were between 0.5237015, 1.5336636.

Margin of Error: The 95% credibility interval for this survey is +/- 2.6%, which includes the square root of the design effect (DEFT): 1.0249548.



Methodology: MaxDiff Analysis: Respondents saw 5 iterations of 4 random issues and were asked to select the most and least important issue to their vote for each iteration. The attributes are ranked based on the following formula: (# times attribute was selected as most important - # times attribute was selected as least important) / # times the item appeared. Each percentage indicates the share that that attribute was selected as most important, least important, or not selected.




