Methodology

Poll number: pr1916

Interview Dates: July 14-17, 2019

Sample Population: 820 registered voters in Michigan.

Sample Selection: Scientific online poll - stratified sample of panel respondents.

Weighting Parameters: The sample was weighted based on the U.S. Census Bureau's Voting and Registration Supplement to the Current Population Survey for registered voters in Michigan based on age, gender, race, Hispanic ethnicity, and educational attainment.

Figures may or may not sum to 100% and this is due to the effects of rounding and weighting. The standard deviation of the weights was: 0.1629138. The maximum weight was: 1.5574243. The minimum weight was: 0.5292705. 95% of the weights were between 0.728568, 1.5005408.

Margin of Error: The 95% credibility interval for this survey is +/- 3.4%, which includes the square root of the design effect (DEFT): 1.0131676.
